On-Going

Karson Konstruktion has moved in! They have set up their construction office at 141 Main Street just north of Oblate Avenue. Here's what they are working on:

- Utility locates
- Tree removal and tree protection
- Removal of asphalt and concrete base north of Hawthorne Avenue

Up-Coming

Karson Konstruction will focus their work between Echo Drive and Clegg Street for the first part of this construction season. Here are their key objectives for the next two weeks:

- Install sanitary sewer from just south of the Queensway to Hawthorne Avenue
- Removal of asphalt and concrete base from the closed Northbound lanes (east side of Main Street from Lees Avenue to Clegg Street)
- Continue with tree removals north of Clegg Street
- Set-up for the watermain installation starting at Clegg Street
- Retaining wall at Immaculata High School

Traffic

The section between Hawthorne Avenue and Lees Avenue is reduced from 4 lanes to 2 lanes (one lane in each direction). Starting on May 25th (or on May 24th at 8pm to be precise), the two northbound lanes between Clegg Street and Lees Avenue as well as the northbound lane between Greenfield Avenue and Echo Drive will be closed to traffic.





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Did you know?

Just like you, before digging, our Contractor must contact Ontario One Call to request a locate. All underground infrastructure is identified in the field (by paint mark and flags) and on paper. These locates are refreshed once a month until the work is complete. These locates are important to the Contractor and we ask the public to not remove or disturb them!
