Background

- In May 2011, Council directed City staff to pursue an accelerated implementation schedule that advanced the delivery date of the project by more than a year
- The City has provided RTG with maximum flexibility to deliver the project according to that schedule and the budget laid out by Council
- This includes providing them with temporary access to any City-owned lands they require to serve as construction staging

Confederation Line Impacts on University of Ottawa

- Confederation Line construction will displace approximately 230 parking spots at the University of Ottawa to make way for construction staging
- The City wants to avoid having those vehicles circulate through the neighbourhood looking for on-street parking and further complicating a difficult street parking situation
- The MOU with the University offers our commitment to provide them with alternate parking arrangements in an effort to reduce community impacts




Arriving at 160 Lees

- The City examined a number of different sites for possible staging and alternate parking and has received a number of suggestions from the community
- Complications include:
 - City not owning the land (MTO, NCC, Private)
 - Private parking lots already at capacity
 - Lands already scheduled to be used as construction staging



- City initiated temporary
 Zoning By-law
 Amendment application
 for 160 Lees Avenue
- Proposes a parking lot for a period of three years
- Extension of use would require an additional zoning amendment






- Policy framework:
 - Official Plan northern portion designated Mixed Use Centre and southern portion designated Major Open Space
 - OOE Secondary Plan northern portion designated
 Mixed Use Centre and
 southern portion designated
 Open Space





- Policy framework (con'd):
 - Transportation Master Plan –
 Alta Vista Transportation
 Corridor identified as a Phase
 2 project (2016 2022)
- Current Zoning
 - Residential Fourth Density
 Zone Subzone M (R4M)





- Application Status
 - Circulation period ends
 January 4, 2013
 - Scheduled to be heard at Planning Committee on January 14, 2013
 - Accompanying site plan control application to be submitted






- Consultation Process
 - Encouraged to submit comments before Jan. 4th
 - Opportunity at Planning Committee (on Jan. 14th) to provide comments - written submission or making a presentation
 - Consultation during the site plan control process
 - Option to submit an appeal to the OMB



Alternative Site Plan Concept





- Council voted unanimously today to accept RTG's submission and move forward with the project
- Our goal is to minimize community impacts as much as possible while still moving the Confederation Line forward along the accelerated schedule and budget directed by Council
- We want to continue to work with the community through the site plan process to achieve the best possible outcome for all concerned



Confederation Line Benefits

- Significantly improved transit service and access to the Lees station
- Redesign of the Lees pedestrian crossing into the station to make it more user friendly as part of the project
- Improved pathway connections around the community to better integrate cyclists and pedestrians into the City's transit network and existing pathway system
